The Contra Costa County Board of Supervisors passed an ordinance that allows officials to fine people and businesses for violating pandemic health orders, such as not wearing masks and not practicing social distancing. For individuals, the fines are \$100 for a first offense, \$200 for a second, and

\$500 for a third. And so, mask up, stay healthy, and avoid fines!



Parish Office Hours


